We at the Vietnamese American Roundtable (VAR) have been following issues with Reid-Hillview for the past few years. We are supportive of efforts to transition a 180-acre airport property into a sustainable community asset. 

Dear Santa Clara County Supervisors:

I write to express my strong opposition to Agenda Item 10.

Reid-Hillview Airport has tremendous value for the county and its neighbors. It should be developed, not closed:

- Numerous charity organizations operate out of it: Angel Flight West, CalDART, Pilots and Paws, Civil Air Patrol, and occasionally Cal Fire, to name a few. All of these organizations directly benefit non-pilots in the county
- Aviation jobs are currently one of the hottest employment markets, offering work for folks with or without college degrees. Reid Hillview is a non-threatening local resource for residents near the airport
- Aerospace technology is disruption what we think of as aviation. Drones, air taxis, autonomous vehicles, and electric aircraft will democratize aviation in the same way that computers went from mainframes to PCs to cell phones; widely used, accessible, and cheap. What won't be available in this new world will be space for airports. Vertical take off and landing is certainly part of the equation, but fixed wing aircraft use less power, are less noisy go farther, carry more and air cheaper to operate. It's physics. Battery and motor tech, and AI won't change this basic tradeoff. Drone operations are already moving towards winged vehicles. Get rid of the airport and runways, and you have made the county less competitive, and deprived county residents – especially those near the airport, an economic opportunity for good paying jobs to support this industry.
- Diversity is more than just ethnic heritage and sexual preference. It's respecting a diversity of paths through life, and not letting "the tyranny of the majority" for people not following the mainstream. Aviation, especially, general aviation, should be protected just for this reason. California is the state where people have the freedom to make their own path in life, and our supervisors should support and maximize the diversity that comes from that. If you need a reason, that mindset is part of the innovation that drives the state. As an example, amateur built aircraft trailblazed the use of composite construction and carbon fiber, that is now use widely, not only in aircraft, but almost all device construction.

Now for the less nice part:

- To be blunt, the lead argument for closing the airport is bogus. The study was underpowered statistically, offers no mechanism to support the idea that aircraft flying overhead are causing lead contamination to any degree, had no follow up testing of children to validate the statistics (standard practice of a study of this kind), and other studies, such as the ground study, refute its conclusions.
- Frankly the board's motives are inconsistent with the goal of protecting children for lead contamination. If the board's motivation was to protect children from lead poisoning, follow up with additional blood testing to validate the study, work to reconcile (not hide) the studies that contradict it, and work to eliminate other mechanisms (such as lead paint) as a potential source of lead contamination. Someone protecting children would want to conclusively confirm the source of contamination so the right action would be taken. Otherwise the actual source of the problem wouldn't be fixed leaving children to continue to suffer. The evidence seriously questions the source of lead being the airport, but the board still focuses on closing it.

Add to that the fact that a) the airport sells no leaded fuel, b) the vast majority of aircraft flying at Reid Hillview don't use leaded fuel, and that 100UL is in the pipeline and will shortly supply the remaining aircraft that can't burn 94UL. Yet the same argument is being made to close the airport. Nothing about closing San Martin airport, or pushing to close Palo Alto, Hayward or other airports close to high density residences. The evidence points to a land grab, and an attempt to replicate Zoe Lofgren's success getting to federal office, partly on the back of Reid Hillview a few decades ago (again on an argument unsupported by facts). The board doesn't look good here; clueless at best, corrupt at worst. Not the government that supports its diverse citizenry.

It's hard not to see the board, or at least Supervisor Chavez - with the implicit support of the other board members – use fear tactics to avoid having to have a fact based discussion about the different tradeoffs about keeping the airport letting the data, and the sober will of the people decide. Instead, they are stooping low; using fear, lying about the facts, hiding their actual motives. Tactics that the country has been suffering from over the last decade. I thought Santa Clara was better than that...

I strongly support Reid Hillview Airport and demand you reject this item.

Dear President Ellenberg and Honorable Supervisors,

As a Santa Clara County resident, I sincerely appreciate President Ellenberg and Supervisor Arenas' steadfast leadership and dedication, particularly concerning the upcoming Item 10 report on the April 16th Board of Supervisors' agenda.

On February 6, 2024, President Ellenberg and Supervisor Arenas voiced their concerns to their fellow Supervisors with clarity and conviction. Their message, "This is not a good time to spend taxpayer dollars on projects that could be seven or more years out. Let's wait a year or two so the budget can handle these types of projects," is especially appreciated. I understand the intricacies of budget management, especially in these challenging times of severe budget deficits. However, spending \$300,000 for a Vision Plan and the potential of looking for resources of \$1,000,000+ for baseball fields should be delayed. To include land issues with the VTA and Eastridge developments in Item #10 is inappropriate. The VTA issue could lead to more taxpayer dollars being requested through bonds and tax increases. This is not what the taxpayers need at this time. Therefore, the VTA and Eastridge items must be separated from the Little League and Vision Plan expenses. The County has spent over \$2,000,000 on various efforts to close (or study closing) Reid-Hillview – all without any concurrence from the FAA that they would allow this to happen. I urge Supervisors Lee, Simitian, and Chavez to carefully consider the potential consequences of this report. The FAA response, the possible cost of legal issues, and the concerns that President Ellenberg and Supervisor Arenas have raised are all significant factors that could have a profound impact.

It is of utmost importance that you, as the Supervisors, understand the gravity of the impact of your vote should it be other than to receive the report and that no action will be taken for at least one to two years. The decisions you make will have a direct and significant effect on our County, and we trust in your ability to consider this responsibility seriously.
