Focus on continuous learning and improvement, and commitment to transparency and accountability; the ultimate goal is to keep children safe and families whole.





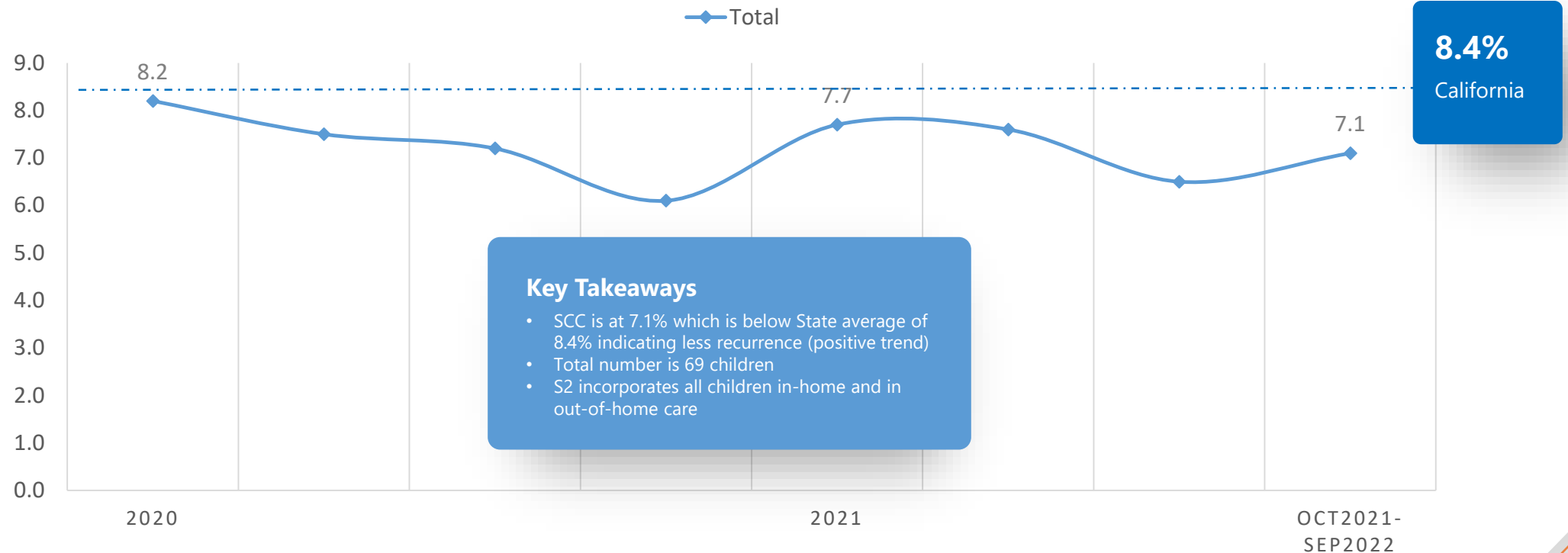

SANTA CLARA: JANUARY 2020 - SEPTEMBER 2022





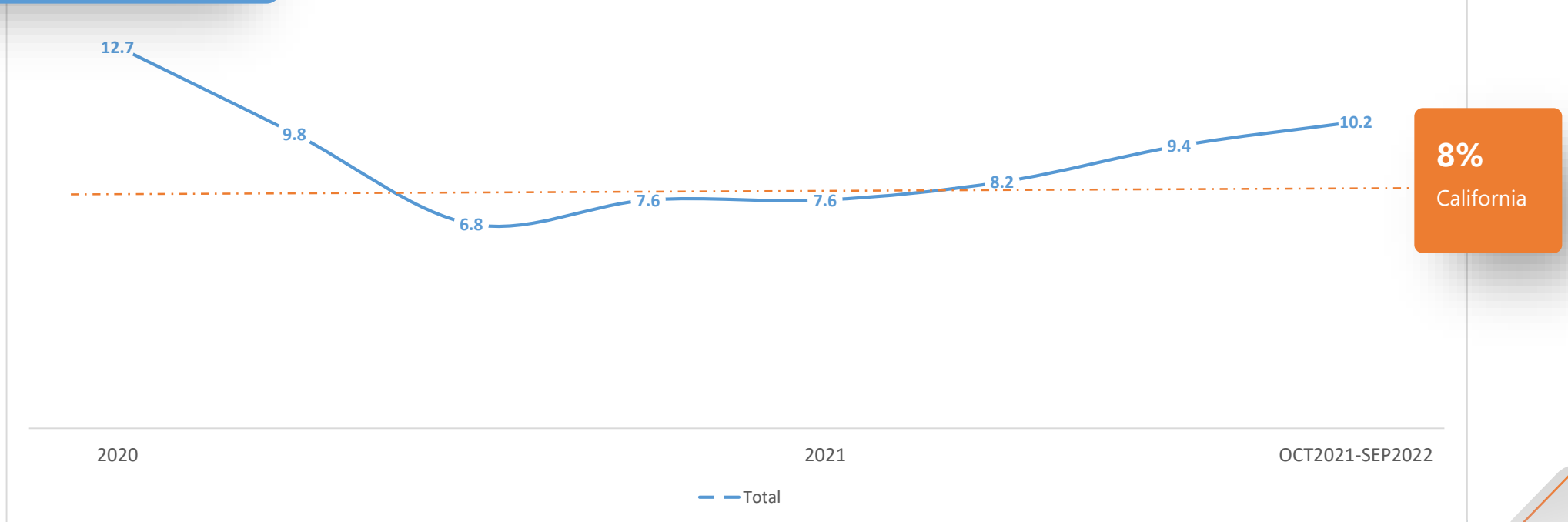

P4 – Re-Entry (12 months)

Key Takeaways

- SCC is 10.2% vs State 8%; total number of children re-entering is 20
- Approximately one third of re-entry population is children under two
- SCC has a reduced overall # children in cohort; so, greater proportional impacts

PATHWAY FORWARD

Plans of Safe Care

Establishing a comprehensive approach to coordinated services spanning various points of intervention from prior to baby's birth to supporting the newborn who are substance exposed, to supporting families where parents or caregivers struggle with substance use; and expanding the availability of treatment, including residential and out-patient treatment and support services to pregnant women and parents.





PATHWAY FORWARD

Board Direction

Probation and DFCS Nexus

Nexus of intervention between child welfare practices and impact to Juvenile Justice.

Legal Consultation

Analysis of legal staffing process to further integrate child and family team and social worker voice throughout.

System Improvement and Data Reports

Self-assessment, system improvement plan, and critical incident tracking.



Increased Oversight of DFCS cases

Innovative programs and court supervision of family maintenance cases.

Improved Abuse Reporting Systems

Enhance partnership between DFCS, DA, and local law enforcement agencies through electronic reporting.

Child Abuse Neglect Center (CANC) Data

Child abuse hotline processes, data collection, and aligning resources to support effective response.
