A. BACKGROUND (Describe the good or services procured)

Santa Clara Valley Healthcare (SCVH) requests an extension of the Agreement with Lisa Geisinger, dba OncoTeam, to conduct cancer registry case finding and abstraction services through June 30, 2024. The SCVH Cancer Center provides life-saving treatment to patients diagnosed with cancer through various treatment regimens and maintains a cancer registry (database of cancer cases). SCVH maintains a cancer registry in accordance with State law, which since 1985 mandated every hospital in California to collect and report an extensive data set for every cancer case. This function is known as cancer abstracting and must be performed by qualified Certified Tumor Registrars (CTRs). OncoTeam trains and manages CTRs who complete cancer registry case finding and abstracting. This includes reviewing multiple sources of information to identify and process cancer cases, and then abstracting these cases and reporting them to the State. The cancer registry is maintained on site, and the collected information is used to evaluate cancer trends, caseload, quality of treatment, and survival as compared to national benchmarks. OncoTeam runs reports and analyzes the cancer registry data, which includes using software applications and databases specifically designed for cancer registry operations and statistical analysis. Abstracted cancer cases are also discussed by a multidisciplinary care team to develop targeted treatment plans for complex patient cases and to ensure quality assurance. The data submitted to the State is used to inform extensive State and National cancer research, including large-scale evaluation of treatment efficacies and consequently the development of national treatment guidelines. Furthermore, OncoTeam provides oversight of SCVH's Tumor Board, Cancer Care Committee, and American College of Surgeons (ACS) accreditation.

B. CONTRACT HISTORY, if applicable. (How was the contract awarded? What were the events that occurred prior to the end of the contract term?)

On September 24, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved the Original Agreement with Lisa Geisinger, dba OncoTeam with a not to exceed amount of \$150,000 for the period of April 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

On July 1, 2014, the Deputy County Executive pursuant to its delegated authority under the FY15 Master Contract List approved the First Amendment with no increase to the maximum and extending the term through June 30, 2015.

On June 10, 2015, the Deputy County Executive pursuant to its delegated authority under the FY16 Master Contract List approved the Second Amendment increasing the maximum financial obligation by \$150,000 from \$150,000 to \$300,000 and extending the term through June 30, 2016.

On June 20, 2016, the Deputy County Executive pursuant to its delegated authority under the FY17 Master Contract List approved the Third Amendment increasing the maximum financial obligation by \$150,000 from \$300,000 to \$450,000 and extending the term through June 30, 2017.

On June 14, 2017, the Deputy County Executive pursuant to its delegated authority under the FY18 Master Contract List approved the Fourth Amendment increasing the maximum financial obligation by \$150,000 from \$450,000 to \$600,000 and extending the term through June 30, 2018.

On February 15, 2018, the Deputy County Executive pursuant to its delegated authority under the FY18 Master Contract List approved the Fifth Amendment revising the scope of services only with no change to the maximum financial obligation nor the term.

On May 31, 2018, the Deputy County Executive pursuant to its delegated authority under the FY18 Master Contract List approved the Sixth Amendment increasing the maximum financial obligation by \$4,760 from \$600,000 to \$604,760 with no change to the term.

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C. REASONS FOR CONTRACT TERM EXTENSION (Provide an explanation to support your selection in Section VI, including any relevant market research)

SCVH requests to extend the agreement with OncoTeam in order to continue meeting State and Federally mandated cancer reporting requirements through June 30, 2024, while providing SCVH sufficient time to exercise the competitive solicitation process to identify, contract, and transition services to a new vendor. Since September 2013, OncoTeam has maintained and reported all appropriate cancer registry information in order to meet regulatory guidelines. OncoTeam has trained and managed Certified Tumor Registrars (CTRs) who consistently and accurately performed case finding services, ensuring compliance with State and Federal cancer reporting requirements. Case abstracting for cancer registry services is complex and requires special expertise in epidemiology, anatomy, medical terminology, treatment therapies as well as knowledge of SCVH's electronic health record system.

The American College of Surgeons requires CTR credentials to perform the abstracting function in accredited facilities. Accordingly, SCVH requests to maintain OncoTeam's services, as they have demonstrated the required knowledge and expertise to perform these essential services, and due to the continual shortage of qualified CTRs and unsuccessful recruitment of a permanent employee.

D. RECOMMENDATION TO CURE ISSUE(S) (If applicable)

The Contract Solutions Department and the Ambulatory Care Health System Department are currently working to release a new RFP for cancer registry case finding and abstracting consulting services.

The requested extension will allow SCVH to continue contracting with OncoTeam for cancer registry case finding and abstracting services in order to meet State and Federally mandated cancer reporting requirements, as well as to provide the County sufficient time to exercise the competitive solicitation process to identify, contract, and transition services to a new vendor. The Contract Solutions Department is currently working on the RFP, while the FERC request to issue the RFP has been submitted and is pending approval.

MAL 1280 has been submitted and approved. The Department is currently finalizing the scope of services to appropriately address the County's needs.
