

Community Violence Intervention Mapping

- **Goal:** Respond to BOS referral (May 24, 2022, Item No. 25) to:
 - conduct a mapping of **community-based** gun violence prevention and intervention efforts at a neighborhood level,
 - identify gaps and disparities
 - target current and future investment
- **Scope:** primarily non-law enforcement led, community-based interventions addressing interpersonal violence.
- **Framework:** Incorporating concepts from several sources: definition of community violence¹, community violence intervention², and spectrum of community violence intervention.³

CVI Framework



Community building

Improving built environment and building communities, e.g., neighborhood cleanup, graffiti removal, resident leadership



Intervention

Targeting youth with risk-factors, stopping the cycle of violence. eg.: street outreach, SJ YEA programs, hospital-based violence intervention



Prevention

Pro-social activities, increasing protective factors, e.g., youth sports, art, music, technology, mentorship

Methodology



Data collection methodology


- **Key informant interviews** with staff from County, city, and community-based organizations with broad knowledge of CVI work in target zip codes
- Key informant completion of **spreadsheet** with information on each program, organization, strategy, and locations served
- Brief **surveys** with frontline staff at service provider meetings
- Review of other **scans and documents** provided by partners
- **Web search** to supplement and verify program's location, description, and eligibility information


Map of San José

Violence Prevention Strategies in select zip codes, City of San Jose, Santa Clara County




Map of Gilroy (95020)

Conclusions



Conclusions

Findings:

- A mix of **County- and city-led programs** in partnership with CBOs is needed for success.
- **Gaps include** healing-centered restorative practices, engaging faith partners in neighborhood organizing, violence prevention education and awareness campaigns.
- Need for more **resident leadership development in Gilroy** zip code (95020), and more government and **CBO investment in 95117**, to build upon existing collaborations and scale up their impact.

Next steps:

- Violence Prevention **Grant evaluation committee** will use identified gaps and opportunities to guide the assessment of proposals.
 - PHD to develop **web-based version of maps** to allow refined look at census tract level.
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Scope and Parameters

Included	Not included or not covered comprehensively
Programs that address youth violence, gang violence, gun violence, street violence, and other types of interpersonal violence that occur outside of the home and in a community setting	Programs that address domestic violence, intimate partner violence, gun suicide, self-harm, accidental injuries
Programs that take place in a community setting, outside of the walls of institutions.	Programs that take place within the criminal justice system, the educational system, the mental health system, or the healthcare system.
Programs that directly address community violence or gun violence	Programs that are focused on other issues, such as substance use or behavioral health, that intersect and contribute to violence.

Strategies Included in Mapping

Type of Strategy	Specific Strategies
<p><u>Community Building</u> Programs that improve safety and wellbeing for the whole community, improve built environment, build resident capacity and leadership, promote healing and restoration in a collective space, developing solutions at a community level and not an individual level</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Developing culturally-centered trauma healing practices • Supporting restorative justice programs • Beautifying neighborhoods: tree planting, removing graffiti and blight, litter pickup • Renovating, repairing, or improving apartment complexes and surrounding areas: fixing broken windows, building sidewalks, adding lights, improving recreational facilities, etc. • Improving parks to increase community safety and use • Hosting community events to increase use of public space, enhance social cohesion, and uplift community voice • Creating community gardens and other connections to nature • Training resident leaders and/or developing tenant and neighborhood associations • Violence prevention education and awareness raising
<p><u>Intervention</u> Programs to divert youth from entering or re-entering the criminal justice system and giving them alternative pathways; services to prevent retaliation and break the cycle of violence between groups. Often, these services are geared toward youth who are considered "high risk", are known to police, or already have involvement with the law.</p> <p>Also includes services for victims to support healing, recovery, and moving away from gang association.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School-based violence intervention programs • Safe passage - protection/support for kids going to and from school • Street outreach and violence intervention programs • Hospital-based violence intervention programs • Victim support/assistance: counseling, funeral costs, mental health supports, food, basic needs, deterrence for retribution • Trauma-informed programs with cognitive behavioral therapy • Faith-based interventions • Gender-based interventions • LGBTQ-centered violence intervention
<p><u>Prevention</u> Programs for young teens and/or youth of all ages who live in underserved or violence impacted areas; providing positive, pro-social activities, educational enrichment, family supports, caring adults and mentors, career development, positive/protective factors, etc.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supporting youth leadership development through arts, music, technology, nature, and sports • Mentorship and coaching • Workforce training interventions – Job Corps etc.

Maps of Zip Code in Gilroy





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


Maps of Zip Codes in San José




East San José




Violence Prevention Strategies in zip code 95116, Santa Clara County








West San José
